ANOTHER GOOD RESULT FOR THE TRUCKS MARKET IN AUGUST (+20.5%), ALSO THANKS TO THE COMPARISON WITH AN AUGUST -22.4%, WHILE THE TREND IS STILL NEGATIVE FOR TOWED VEHICLES (-11.9%) AND BUSES GET WORSE (-63.4%)

The incentives to support investments in the road transport sector, available since the end of July, have only partially started to push the market. ANFIA hopes that the resources of the fiscal decree not yet used due to implementation delays will be extended to next year, since they are going to expire today

Turin, September 30th 2020 - After the recovering registered in July, in August trucks markets keep growing in double-digit (+20,5%), thanks also to a comparison with August 2019 which closed with -22.4%, while towed vehicles, keep a negative variation (-11.9%). Both sectors close the first eight months of the year with strong double-digit decreases.

The data show how the incentives for investment support in the road transport sector, available since the end of July, have only partially started to boost the market. For the recovery in the short and medium term are fundamental, as well as the resources of the fiscal decree not yet used due to implementation delays and expiring today, 30 September, which we hope can be extended to next year at the earliest.

Looking at the numbers, during August 2020, have been released 1,383 certifications of new trucks (+20.5% respect to August 2019) and 602 certifications of new heavy trailers and semitrailers, with GVW over 3,500 kg (-11.9%), divided this way: 73 trailers (+10.6%) and 529 semitrailers (-14.3%).

During the period from January to August 2020 have been released 12,836 certifications of **new trucks**, the 23.5% less respect to the period January-August 2019, and 7,204 certifications of new **heavy trailers and semitrailers** (-31.3% respect January-August 2019 which means 3,300 certifications less), divided this way: 679 trailers (-32.2%) and 6,525 semitrailers (-31.2%).

Analyzing the market by geographical areas, in the first eight months of 2020, the worst contractions have been registered for trucks market in the North-West and in the North-East of the country: -29%. In the Center and in the South regions instead the slowdown has been respectively by 9% and by 20%.

Looking at trailers and semitrailers, in the progressive of 2020, international brands lose the 37% of the market, while national ones contain the loss reaching the 23%.

Buses market with GVW over 3.500 kg in August registers only 189 new units, with a slowdown of 63.4% (it was of 17.6% in July 2020). All sectors close the month with a negative sign: -77.5% for LPT buses, which register the biggest decrease, -33.8% for tourist buses and midibuses, -28.3% for minibuses and -6.9% for schoolbuses.



In the first eight months of 2020, buses certifications released have been 1,998 (-29.1%, which means 800 buses less respect to January-August 2019). As happened in the past three months, also in August keep the positive sign in the cumulate since the beginning of the year only for minibuses (+4.5%), while confirm the double-digit decrease for LPT buses (-39.3%), tourist buses and midibuses (-22.4%) and schoolbuses (-40.9%).

In the subdivision of the market by geographical areas, in the first eight months of year, the lightest contraction is registered in the North East of the country (-9.9%) while the strongest in the North-West (-44%).

With regard to measures aimed at supporting the public transport services in this current delicate phase, it is important to underline the 8 September 2020 decree-law, which introduces urgent measures in view of the start of the school year following the epidemiological emergency. The decree provides for the possibility to use the resources already allocated to support local public transport by the decree-laws "Relaunch" and "August", also for the financing, within the limit of 300 million euros, of additional local and regional public transport services also for students, necessary for the implementation of the guidelines for the containment of the spread of Covid-19.
